TECH SHEET—2 DRY COWS

The dry cow period is one of the most important stages of a dairy cow's lactation cycle. It gives the cow a chance to recover from the last lactation and lay the groundwork for a successful future lactation. Proper dry cow feeding will reduce fresh cow problems such as ketosis, retained placentas and displaced abomasums.

Here is a product that can help to meet dry cow nutrient requirements, even with the variable nutrient value of pasture grazing! This product is designed for free-choice feeding, with cows consuming approximately 0.2-0.3 lbs per head per day. It contains kelp to aid intakes.

A product specially formulated to provide dry cows with necessary nutrients, with 100% of the selenium provided by selenium-yeast from approved sources. The nutrients supplied by this product are highly available, helping to prepare your cow for calving and lactation. It can be fed mixed in a grain or protein mix, in a TMR, or top dressed over grain or silage. This is added to feed at a rate of 0.35-0.45 lb per head per day.
